Maggie who lived as some one half her age always had fun on set and loved to play Blanche.

Actor William Roach (Ken Barlow) commented: "She was amazing and had a dry wit and very funny if not even funnier also I don't think she knew how much she was loved not just by everyone on set but all her fans, she will be greatly missed."

Actress Jane Danton, who plays Leanne Battersby, said: "We all feel so bad and now she's in peace with Joe. Working with the Barlow's will never be the same without Blanche. We all loved her so much."

The character who was loved for all her comments became a favourite corrie star for all her fans.

The star was rushed to hospital in October and it is unknown what she was being treated for. The star, who graduated from The Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts, husband died in 1999 and know she is with him.

Maggie's last appearance was on November 20, and she got drunk and told Simon's new Grand dad and his wife all their embarrassing secrets.

The soaps Producer called her a much loved colleague and a wonderful actress who turned Blanche into a wonderful character.

Maggie who died on Wednesday was a brilliant actress and made the show what it is, as the show is filmed six weeks earlier she will be on our show for another six weeks.

Roache, who played Blanche's son in law said: "Maggie was a big part of the Barlow family and a brilliant actress."

Maggie has won several soap awards for Blanche after only become one of the cast members in 1999. Her first appearance on the show was when she played a police-women in 1961. Maggie has played at various plays including Pride And Prejudice also she played in the play The Women.

She guest appeared on Good Night Sweetheart, Daziel and Pascoe, Heartbeat and peak practice.

When Maggie was rushed to hospital last October they had to plan to see how she leaves the show.

In 2005 and 2009 she won a British Soap award for best comedy performance in a British soap.
